
Takeaways

- As of 2023 the region's population **declined by 5.1**% since 2018, falling by 1,158. Population is expected to **decrease by 9.4**% between 2023 and 2028, losing 2,044.
- From 2018 to 2023, jobs increased by 7.3% in Bandera County, TX from 4,836 to 5,188. This change outpaced the national growth rate of 3.9% by 3.4%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate increased from 50.5% to 58.8% between 2018 and 2023.
- Concerning educational attainment, **17.2% of Bandera County, TX residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (3.9% below the national average), and **11.0% hold an Associate's Degree** (2.2% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2023 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Local Government, Excluding Education and Hospitals.








Unemployment by Gender





Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends






Veterans

Bandera County, TX has 2,275 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 1,131.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Bandera County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 6,627 people 55 or older, while there are 10,400 here.




Violent Crime

Racial diversity is low in Bandera County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 9,095 racially diverse people, while there are 5,726 here.




Property Crime










Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Employment Concentration






Top Industry GRP






Top Occupation Employment Concentration




