- From 2017 to 2022, jobs increased by 5.1% in Bexar County, TX from 988,511 to 1,039,204. This change outpaced the national growth rate of 3.8% by 1.3%. As the number of jobs increased, the labor force participation rate increased from 61.5% to 63.1% between 2017 and 2022.
- Concerning educational attainment, **18.6% of Bexar County, TX residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (2.2% below the national average), and **8.4% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.4% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2022 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and Federal Government, Military.




Apr 2023 Labor Force Breakdown






Unemployment by Gender

Unemployment by Ethnicity





Population Trends



Job Trends



Labor Force Participation Rate Trends




Bexar County, TX had an April 2023 unemployment rate of 3.47%, increasing from 3.38% 5 years before.






Bexar County, TX has 144,053 veterans. The national average for

an area this size is 106,524.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is low in Bexar County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 602,866 people 55 or older, while there are 469,346 here.




Violent Crime

Racial diversity is high in Bexar County, TX. The national average for an area this size is 825,367 racially diverse people, while there are 1,498,029 here.




Property Crime










Top Growing Industries




Top Industry Employment Concentration








Top Industry GRP








Top Occupation Employment Concentration







Educational Pipeline

In 2021, there were 32,705 graduates in Bexar County, TX. This pipeline has remained stable (neither grown nor shrunk) over the last 5 years. The highest share of these graduates come from "General Studies" (Associate's), "Liberal Arts and Sciences/Liberal Studies" (Associate's), and "Registered Nursing/Registered Nurse" (Associate's).
